Day 1 (Sunday April 5, 2026)

Reading: II Kings 8

Questions:

- Why did the Shunamite woman go to the land of the Philistines? What problem did she have when she returned?
- Why did Elisha weep before Hazael? How did Hazael become king of Syria?
- Why did God not destroy Judah, despite Jehoram's great sin? What does this tell us about God's promises?

Prayer for: Personal renewal of body & spirit

Day 2 - Monday

Reading: II Kings 9

Questions:

- For the punishment of what crime did God have Jehu anointed king over Israel?
- What explanation did Jehu give that prevented peace in Israel?
- What meaning does God's severe judgment on the wickedness of those days have for us today?

Prayer for: To be faithful managers of our time, talents, and treasure

Day 3 - Tuesday

Reading: II Kings 10

Questions:

- Discuss the judgment of Ahab's 70 sons as compared to the grace made available to us thru Jesus?
- What do you make of Jehu's "cunning" to destroy the prophets of Baal and his worshippers?
- What is the meaning of the description "Jehu was not careful to walk in the law of the Lord with all his heart"?

Prayer for: Physical health & strength for ourselves, family & friends

Day 4 - Wednesday

Reading: II Kings 11 – 12

Questions:

- What all was done to preserve Joah alive and make him king over Judah?
- Discuss Jehoida's covenant (11:17)
- How did it happen that Jehoash reigned so long and so well in Jerusalem? What important work did Jehoash do?

Prayer for: Spiritual revival of the community and nation

Day 5 - Thursday

Reading: II Kings 13

Questions:

- Describe the reign of Jehoahaz and God's judgment and mercy during this time.
- What do you take away from the description of the reign Jehoash over Israel ((134: 10 – 13
- Recount some of the miracles God did by Elisha, during his lifetime.

Prayer for: Effectiveness of Bethel's ministries

Day 6 - Friday

Reading: II Kings 14

Questions:

- How does chapter 14 compare and contrast Amaziah's reign in Judah with David's? What things did he fail to do?
- Why do you think there was so much death and warfare in Israel and Judah? What had God told David about this? For what sin of David's was this all the judgment?
- How was it that king Amaziah, who did evil in the sight of the Lord, yet restored the border of Isarael according to the word of the Lord?

Prayer for: Opportunities to share the Gospel with family & friends

Day 7 - Saturday

Reading: II Kings 15 – 16

Questions:

- While Ahaziah did what was right in God's eyes, what did he fail to do?
- What stands out to you about the reign of the six kings Zechariah, Shallum, Manahem, Pekahiah, Pekah, and Jotham? (15: 8 – 38)
- What despicable act did Ahaz commit that was like the nations around him?
