

Weekly Discipleship Plan (Week of July 5 – 11, 2026)

Catechism Question: (2/5)

Children's Catechism

Q. 37. What does every sin deserve?

A. The wrath and curse of God.

Q. 38. Can any one go to heaven with this sinful nature?

A. No; our hearts must be changed before we can be fit for heaven.

Shorter Catechism

Q46. What does the first commandment require?

A: The first commandment requires us to know and recognize God as the only true God and our God, and to worship and glorify Him accordingly.

Q47. What does the first commandment forbid?

A: The first commandment forbids denying God or not worshipping and glorifying Him as the true God and our God. It also forbids giving worship and glory, which He alone deserves, to anyone or anything else.

Deut. 6:4 "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. 6:5 You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. 6:6 And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. 6:7 You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.

DAILY DEVOTIONS

Day 1 (Sunday July 5)

Reading: Job 36- 37

Questions:

- Summarize Elihu's main points from ch. 36
- Summarize Elihu's main points from ch. 37
- Do you think Elihu is correct in what he says, and how he says it?

Prayer for: For the effectiveness of Bethel's ministries

Day 2 - Monday

Reading: Job 38 -39

Questions:

- What is the context for / focus of God's first series of questions for Job?
- In asking if Job knows about these questions regarding Creation, who should Job understand can answer them? What should Job then conclude about (1) himself, and (2) God?

Prayer for: Isa 26:3 – God keep our minds focused on Him, and give us His peace.

Day 3 - Tuesday

Reading: Job 40-42

Questions:

- From ch. 40, what is God's summary question (in your own words)? What is Job's reply?
- Summarize Job's final response in 42: 1-6.
- How does God deal with (1) Job's friends and (2) Job as the book closes out? What lessons can we learn from each of these?

Prayer for: Matt 6 – That God's kingdom come, beginning with His will being done on earth, more and more

Day 4 - Wednesday

Reading: Psalms 1-6

Questions:

- While Ps. 1 is familiar, what sticks out to you in re-reading it? What else stands out from Psalm 1-6?
- In Ps 2, what point is the writer making as to God's relationship with the nations? How does God address His "Son....begotten?"
- What are David's requests of God in Psalm 5?

Prayer for: Matt 16:18 – For Christ to build His church, and the evil in this world not prevail against the church.

Day 5 - Thursday

Reading: Psalms 7-9

Questions:

- From Psalm 7, how is God David's "refuge"?
- What are some of David's praises of God in Psalm 8?
- Recount (9:1) some of God's wonderful deeds to you. What are some of the things David lists?

Prayer for: To be faithful managers of our time, talents, and treasure

Day 6 - Friday

Reading: Psalms 10 – 16

Questions:

- What are David's "laments" in Psalm 10, 12 and 13?
- What does David say about dwelling with God in His Temple / holy hill (Psalms 11 & 15)
- Summarize / give the main points of Psalm 16

Prayer for: Rom 12: 2 – to not be conformed to this world, but that Christ's renewal of our minds change us

Day 7 - Saturday

Reading: Psalms 17 – 18

Questions:

- What is David's prayer in Psalm 17?
- How does David say his prayer in Psalm 17 has been answered in Psalm 18?

Prayer for: I Pet 4: 19 To entrust ourselves to a faithful Creator, as we do only what is good.
